
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My Voice: A Memoir





Synopsis

Angie Martinez is the "Voice of New York". Now, for the first time, she candidly recounts the story of her rise to become an internationally celebrated hip-hop radio icon. In her current reign at Power 105.1 and for nearly two decades at New York's Hot 97, Angle Martinez has had one of the highest rated radio shows in the country. After working her way up as an intern, she burst on the scene as a young female jock whose on-air "Battle of the Beats" segment broke records and became a platform for emerging artists like a young Jay Z. Angie quickly became known for intimate, high-profile interviews, mediating feuds between artists, and taking on the most controversial issues in hip-hop. At age 25, at the height of the East Coast/West Coast rap war, Angie was summoned by Tupac Shakur for what would be his last no-holds-barred interview - which has never aired in its entirety and which she's never discussed in detail until now. Angle shares stories from behind the scenes of her most controversial conversations, from onetime presidential hopeful Barack Obama to superstars like Mary J. Blige and Chris Brown, and describes her emotional, bittersweet final days at Hot 97 and the highly publicized move to Power 105.1. She also opens up about her personal life from her roots in Washington Heights and her formative years being raised by a single mom in Brooklyn to exploring the lessons that shaped her into the woman she is today. From the Puerto Rican Day Parade to the White House, Angle is universally recognized as a powerful voice in the Latino and hip-hop communities. My Voice gives an inside look at New York City's one-of-a-kind urban radio culture, the changing faces of hip-hop music, and Angie's rise to become the Voice of New York.

I first met Angie Martinez in the middle of the night just after Hot 97 changed their format from dance to hip hop. I had just started Rap Coalition and Wayne Mayo (producer at Hot) introduced us. I liked her openness and honesty immediately! The value of Angie's career (and book) is not only how she touched so many of us daily through her voice and her being, but how she learned as she came up--by doing. She blazed the trail. I never spent much time with Angie because I got busy with my own career but I always felt a kindred-ship with her. She did what was best for all artists rather than what was best for her and her ratings. She didn't tolerate the clowns in the industry just because they were powerful and didn't take money to play records like some of her compadres. She is genuine and authentic, qualities that are hard to find in the music industry AND hard to find in people in general. This is an awesome book because her perspective is based on truth and realness. She worked her way up and was in it for the love, even when the next generation came up focused solely on making money regardless of their love for hip hop (or lack thereof). Angie definitely overstayed at HOT, waiting until long after it had few redeeming gualities left, but I admire her loyalty and her determination to try and create change. She's such an amazing human being as this honest book illustrates. Everyone should read this book, both for the historical aspect of a brand new radio format in the early 90s that impacted the business of hip hop financially for the better and for the value of seeing that great people do win, when they follow their dreams. Go get 'em Angie! You haven't ever changed a bit. You're 100% down to earth and a true inspiration for this next generation of hip hop fans. Where hip hop lives is actually inside of you!!!
